

Guidelines for submitting articles to the *Tyndale Society Journal*

Background

The *Tyndale Society Journal* has a general audience and is not written as an academic journal like "*Reformation*". It is written in English and goes out to members all over the world but mainly in the UK and the USA. Some editions of the *Journal* may focus on a particular topic or anniversary, so not all submissions will be suitable for every edition. A copy of the *Journal* goes out to all paid-up members of the *Tyndale Society*, which includes individuals and some theological colleges and cathedral libraries.

Guidelines

1. Items should be written in English, but you can use your preferred British or American spelling. Our members are across the world including the UK and the USA.
2. Feature articles and book reviews should be **1,200-1,500** words covering an issue in some detail e.g., a Reformer's life story.
3. Short items should be **500-800** words for *ad hoc* items, highly specific news reports or newsflashes (e.g., a Reformer's memorial or childhood home is renovated and reopened to the public), and for our "*How I Met William Tyndale*" series.
4. Photos, graphics and cartoons are welcome but please provide background, label and credit information.
5. Personal insights and observations are welcome. Please avoid jargon terms such as "contextualize", etc., etc.
6. Any items submitted for the *Journal* remain the copyright of the **writer**.
7. The writer gives permission for it to appear later on our [website page](#).
8. Submit articles to our editor Neil Inglis, who is available to provide guidance in case of uncertainty. ([Contact details](#))
9. There is no payment for articles, but writers who are not members of the *Tyndale Society* and who have an article published, will be sent a free copy of the *Journal* in which the article appears. Please supply your address so that it can be posted to you.
10. All submissions are gratefully received. The editor reserves the right to include, edit or not include items which are submitted, but some items which are not included in the next *Journal* maybe held over for a future edition.
